



Local Vendors selling in Museum Store



The Sherman County Historical Museum has a Wish List for new projects and improvements.



<u>SC Trívia</u>

By 1848 many overlanders left the Oregon Trail soon after crossing the John Day River on a "Cutoff to the Barlow Road" through what is today Sherman County. Barlow's Road was a success –

and the Cutoff to the Barlow Road shortened the distance to settlements in the Willamette Valley even more. This "shortcut" also contributed to the settlement of Sherman County, which later became known as the "Golden Land" because of its fields of golden grain. THE PLOW
